Project Background

- Judicial cooperation in criminal proceedings is based on principle of mutual recognition and approximation of laws
- EU-framework decisions (EAW, Transfer of Prisoners, etc.) should strengthen and facilitate judicial cooperation
- Mutual recognition and EU cross-border cooperation are based on mutual trust
- CJEU, Aranyosi/Caldararu C-404/15 and C-659/15 (2016): consolidation of mutual trust and fundamental rights
- Lack of data and research on specific challenges regarding application of EU cross-border instruments in proceedings concerning defendants and detainees with intellectual and/or psychosocial disabilities



Thematic Focus

- Procedural rights and safeguards
- Deprivation of liberty, conditions of detention and reasonable accommodation
- Alternatives to deprivation of liberty and probation measures



Final beneficiaries: defendants and detainees with intellectual and/or psychosocial disabilities
